- Use 1 inch (2.54 cm) margins on all sides except for the header (1/2 inch).
- Put your last name in the header with the page number, so that sheets can be matched together if misplaced.
- Double space all lines.
- Use the *same* font and font size for the title.
- Attach the pages with a paperclip. Some readers prefer to separate the sheets.
- You do *not* need a separate title page for a research paper in MLA standards.
